A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

On this day we honour the gift of the Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Eucharist of Our Lord's Body and Blood. It is a good opportunity to think about the way in which we honour the Blessed Sacrament in our lives and devotion.

It is very easy to be careless in the little signs that we give to honour Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. Before the pandemic, we had got to a really good habit, most of us, of honouring the Lord before receiving him in Holy Communion. We should remember to genuflect or bow before we come forward to receive the host at Mass.

We should also receive reverently, either directly on the tongue, or in the hand. The correct way is to place the open palm of your left hand on top of your right palm. You receive the host on your left hand, and then pick it simply and place it on your tongue. Please do not try to grab the host between your fingers, or move it from one hand to the other before placing it on your tongue, or scrunch the host in a closed hand. And most importantly, never walk away with the host in your hand. You must place it on your tongue before leaving the priest or minister.

Another way we show our veneration for the Blessed Sacrament is by genuflecting and kneeling. We should, if we are able, always genuflect to the tabernacle when we walk in front of it. The only exception is during the Mass, where we bow to the altar, when we only genuflect to the altar after the consecration. Outside of Mass, we should always genuflect.

As well as the external veneration, we should also

ensure that we are receiving Holy Communion as worthily as possible. We should go to Confession at least once a year, and whenever we are aware of serious sin. If we are not regularly attending Mass , we should not present ourselves for Holy Communion until we have been to confession. We should also not go to Communion if we are aware that we are 'living in sin' such as cohabiting in a sexual relationship outside of a valid Catholic marriage. The priest will not refuse Holy Communion, as he is not privy to the state of your soul at any moment. You have to be responsible for the state of your own soul to receive. We cannot absolve ourselves on the basis of a false conscience! We need the Sacraments for our good, and we give the Lord great praise in them.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Ildephonsus 607-667

St Ildephonsus was a 7th century Spanish Archbishop of Toledo. He lived before the Moorish invasion took over the city. He came from a wealthy family, but was called to be a monk. He succeeded his uncle, St Eugenius, as the Archbishop of this important city. He contributed to the great spiritual growth of the city, and the whole country. He particularly nurtured Marian devotion and wrote a book in defence of Our Lady's perpetual virginity. It is said that on 18th December 665, Our Lady appeared to Ildephonsus and gave him a priestly vestment in gratitude for his faithful service.

The New Lectionary

The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. It will come into use on the First Sunday of Advent this year (1st December).

The process of revising the books for the liturgy began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts. The new Lectionary will use the English Standard Version (Catholic Edition) of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter. The portions of Scripture used for each day at Mass are not changing, but the English translation is quite different. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in liturgical setting that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive.

This means we have to buy new Lectionaries for use in Mass for each church. We have ordered and paid for the full 'Ambo' edition for St Joseph's and English Martyrs', and the slightly small 'Chapel' format for St Patrick's. Together with a study edition for the Presbytery, and a Bookf of Gospels the cost (with discount) is around £2,000. The Lectionary will be in four volumes. So each volume costs about £200, or £140 (St Patrick's). If you would like to donate a volume in memory of a loved one, please let Fr Julian know. Donations can be gift aided.

Nearer the time, we will be taking orders for the Sunday Missals or Daily Missals to replace the ones you currently have, with the new version of the readings. Hopefully, we will be able to get a discount on these too! Watch this space for when these will be available to order.
