

SOLEMNITY OF ST PETER & ST PAUL

A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST





Today we celebrate the transferred Solemnity of the princes of the Apostles: St Peter & St Paul. These two great saints are always linked together as the foundation stones of the Church. Each, in their different ways, tell us about what the Church is. Peter was appointed by Christ to be the rock on which the Church was built. He was the first among the twelve apostles chosen by Christ during his life. Peter was the privileged witness to the Resurrection and its first preacher in Jerusalem on Pentecost Sunday. Peter represents the Church's authority to teach in the name of Christ, and to judge teachings in the light of the Gospel. Paul, on the other hand, was the greatest missionary and also theologian of the early Church. He was skilled in taking the teachings of the Jewish elders and showing how Jesus was the fulfilment of God's promises. On first with passion for this Gospel message, he took it to all the corners of the Roman Empire. Both shared a martyr's death,

and their blood continues to bear witness to the power of Christ's Resurrection. It is their martyrdom which marks the Church of Rome as the first among all the Churches, and makes its bishop the successor to St Peter as Pope.

It is good to be reminded of the importance of these two apostles and to try to imitate their faith, their courage, their fidelity to Jesus and their ingenuity in finding new ways of delivering the message with which they were entrusted. They show us the way of renewal in the Church today.

Fundamentally, these were men of prayer. In our Year of Prayer in preparation for the Jubilee Year, we can see how prayer transformed the lives of the saints and gave them the inspiration and courage which we still need today.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Bl John Soreth 1394-1471

John was born in Normandy, and became a Carmelite priest. He was a great scholar and taught in Paris. He became the general superior of the Carmelites. John helped his Order to resist the first stirrings which would lead to the Protestant Reformation. He helped to reform the

order in a true way through his pastoral visits. He was responsible for establishing the first convents of Carmelite nuns. In 1468, there was an invasion in Liege that saw the church invaded, and the mob take and scatter the consecrated hosts on the ground. John rushed in and rescued the Blessed Sacrament at great personal risk

Lawton Rise Goldenhill There won't be any services at Lawton Rise over the summer, to give us a little break. Back in the autumn!



BIDDULPH PRAYER BREAKFAST



The idea of a 'Prayer Breakfast' is not something that we are used to in the Catholic Church. And yet, it is a really simple idea: Christians get together, to eat breakfast, and pray.

As well as in Protestant churches, Prayer Breakfasts have become widespread in towns and cities organised by local Councils. There is one each year in Stoke-on-Trent, for

example.

On Thursday morning, 7am to 9am, we held Biddulph's first Civic Prayer Breakfast at the Town Hall. It was organised by Biddulph Town Council together with the Churches Together. And so Christians from across the churches came together to socialise and have breakfast, and then were led in prayer by the local ministers, including Fr Julian, praying for the town, the schools, police, and local community. There was then a talk from Robert Mountford, Staffs Ecumenical Mission Officer. We hope this will be an annual event and next year Catholics will be more in evidence!

If you give by cash please consider a Standing Order. We are not only charged for making cash deposits, but it also necessitates visits to the bank for the Parish Secretary, as well as time taken counting.

If you pay income tax then you can Gift Aid. To Gift Aid your donations you need a Standing Order or numbered envelopes. If you no longer pay income tax, please contact Teresa in the parish office to stop your Gift Aid. You can still give by Standing Order—no need to cancel it!
